GROUP STUDIES DURING COVID-19

A Lectio — Prayer study was recently held "virtually". Lectio also known as Lectio Divina (Divine Reading) is a type of prayer. This small group study taught the steps to pray using this method. During the 6 weeks, participants watched a video prior to the meeting on FORMED.org, then met online to discuss the questions and content in the



study guide. The feedback from the study was great, due to the content and discussions in our weekly gatherings. The virtual class went so well, we are continuing with another study, Lectio – Eucharist in October.

How does a virtual class differ from the in person class? The "in person" class is longer, as the video would be watched with the group. A virtual class is more focused sticking to the topic more closely. Both allow for expression and discussion.

Have you ever wanted to grow closer to Jesus? Try drawing close to His Mother, Mary. An "in-person" gathering for 33 Days to Morning Glory will begin with Mary Beth Garrity in late October for 6 weeks. This retreat will be held in a large room to allow for social distancing. Mary Beth has led many studies and retreats. She is a wonderful facilitator.

Among the donations were: Diapers, Wipes, Clothing, Blankets, Baby Food/Formula, Bottles, and Personal Care. All items were provided to the Oaks Family Care Center, Oasis of Hope, and Birthcare of Medina.


THE WATERS OF BAPTISM


