
Daniel Plan, 7-Week Lent Series

AND TO BEAR HIS CROSS. SO TO WEAR THE CROWN


HF WORE.






Saint Ambrose School and Littlest Angels Preschool

Eagle Scouts Achievements

According to the Boy Scouts of America, the achievement of making Eagle Scout rank is "not just an award; it is a state of being."

For some, that can be a pretty intimidating statement which is why we turned to John Stracensky, Scout leader and father of three Boy Scouts. Stracensky breaks down that big statement by explaining that a scout's service project should be considered as a "culmination of his whole scouting career: achievements, merit badges, etc. But most importantly, it allows for the boys to take the years of being taught how to lead and put those lessons into practice to plan and execute a project of real, lasting value."

Stracensky shares that it is expected that the boys manage their projects while adults like him are present to facilitate the process. Boys working on their Eagle Scout service projects must mostly assume a more project manager type role in the planning and execution of their project as this is an opportunity really test their leadership abilities rather than measure physical strength.

Here are examples of Eagle Scout service projects that have brought lasting value to our parish and community.





Drainage (2020) **JACOB KELLER**

Last year, Jacob Keller led the Eagle Scout project that allows for the proper drainage of the area by the outdoor Stations of the Cross. This was an important undertaking in that it really set the foundation for a walking path around the Stations of the Cross.



From selling pulled pork sandwiches to recruiting people to help with the laborious hauling of gravel and installing pipes, it is because of Jacob's successful Eagle Scout service project that we are able to safely stroll through the Grotto today and for years to come.

Saint Ambrose School alumni, Matthew Stracensky is responsible for the installation of the Outdoor Stations displayed by the Grotto as a gift to the Saint Ambrose parish community. His project received donations made by organizations such as the Knights of Columbus and funds were also raised through the Music Ministry that he was heavily involved in at the time. Now a student at the University of Notre Dame, Matthew still serves for Masses and

wedding celebrations. The Stations continue to enhance the beauty and the solace the Grotto provides to the many who visit it.

Our sports programs are growing at Saint Ambrose. This past fall, for every reason, all of our fields were full of student athletes. When Tomas Rimac was looking for an Eagle Scout project, he turned to his own passion – sports.
