


Liturgy Corner From the Desk of Nathan Frankart

"Come and see." Those were the words that called me into the Seminary and to consider priesthood. They are the words that so many of our priests today serving in Cleveland have heard in their prayer, but just as importantly, from their friends, family and their parish - come and see.

We celebrate **Priesthood Sunday every last weekend in October** to remember and celebrate the gift of religious vocations. This is not a time simply to be thankful for the priesthood in our lives, but *a time of initiative to encourage more men and women to consider the call of the Lord* in their lives.

Often people forget that Jesus does not simply force a vocation onto people who feel the invitation to be a priest or a religious sister. Rather with a gentle offer, he invites them to consider a life of radical discipleship. Jesus made a community of men and women to follow him intimately. *He gave a proposition to "come and see" how to live a life of great sacrifice, but even greater love, beauty, and total fulfillment.*

We ought to do the same for our young ones. The Lord loves them deeply, and they will be fulfilled if that is where the Lord is inviting them to follow. Encourage religious vocations to those young people around you, and be intentional about what you see in them - "I think you would be a good priest" or "You make a wonderful religious sister." Encourage vocations, for the betterment of the Church, and for the world!







Catholic Charities accepts credit cards, Medicaid, Medicare, and private insurance. They also offer a sliding fee scale to those who qualify.




Donna Bonvissuto, LPC


