MENTAL HEALTH TIPS

Support During the Holiday Season

Although the holidays are joyful and exciting, they can also cause a variety of mental health symptoms... anxiety, panic attacks, depression, and just feeling overwhelmed. In order to prevent some of these symptoms, or lessen them if you have them, here are a few key points to remember:

- **Do not forget self-care.** Take time for yourself, even if it is 30 minutes in a quiet room with a cup of coffee or hot chocolate, or a warm bath or shower with your favorite music playing. Make this a routine daily. Sitting in a quiet room and saying the Rosary - or talking to God - or listening to some spiritual music often helps as well.
- **Create a plan.** Write down what you want/need to accomplish and create a checklist with realistic time frames in which to do them. Crossing out tasks you've completed gives you a feeling of accomplishment.
- Avoid substances. Alcohol and other drugs may appear to give temporary relief of anxiety and numb unwanted feelings, but in actuality, these substances make depression and anxiety worse, as well as disinhibits you, causing you to say and do things you later may regret.
- **Recognize and acknowledge feelings.** Know that it is ok to feel a wide range of feelings during the holidays... do not force happiness... allow yourself to feel whatever you are feeling without feeling guilty.
- **Spend time with others.** Avoid isolation by being with family or friends... or, reach out to someone who you know is also alone. If you cannot find that, volunteer in a soup kitchen, food pantry, or a nursing home.
- Check in with others. A text or phone call can help.
- Honor and celebrate a lost loved one. Instead of avoiding thinking about, or be overcome with sadness and loss, honor and celebrate them with others by telling stories about their life and personality.
- No need to overspend. Focus on being with others, making others happy and not isolated, be supportive of others, make homemade gifts.
- Get fresh air and sunshine. Many studies have shown that mental health symptoms improve when you spend time in nature.
- It is okay to say "NO." Prioritize and simplify when you can. Stay away from situations that stress you out.
- **Take a break.** If a gathering gets stressful, take a break, go take a walk, leave the room, etc.


